MANOR FOUNDATION PHILANTHROPY

We have some really great news - philanthropy is alive and well at the Manor.

A year ago, the Manor Board created the CVM Foundation and funded it with \$12,000,000, which represented half of its investment account. The new Foundation created a Philanthropy Committee, which is chaired by Harry Hanson. Now, things get very interesting. Out of the blue, we received an anonymous challenge grant of \$50,000. With a quiet short campaign, a number of residents made tax deductible gifts to the Foundation, and the challenge grant was met. Then, another resident came forward with an anonymous, unrestricted gift of \$500,000 plus a matching challenge grant of \$500,000 to be completed by the end of 2020.

The Philanthropy Committee is planning a campaign to meet this huge challenge. First, we updated the previous brochure describing gifting opportunities at the Manor. All residents received this brochure on August 14. Next, the committee is inviting residents to an all-residents meeting on September 3, 2019, at 1:30 P.M., in the Meeting House, to hear Dan Baldwin, President/CEO of the Community Foundation of Monterey County. He will explain gifting choices at the Manor. There will be no solicitation of gifts at this meeting. It will be informational only.

The Committee’s goal is to increase our endowment substantially so that life at the Manor will be financially secure for many years to come.

We hope to have a big turnout for the September 3rd meeting and that our residents will think about how they can help meet this exciting challenge grant.

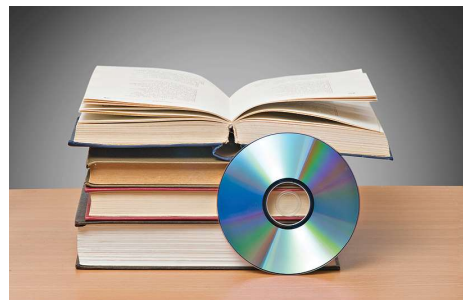
