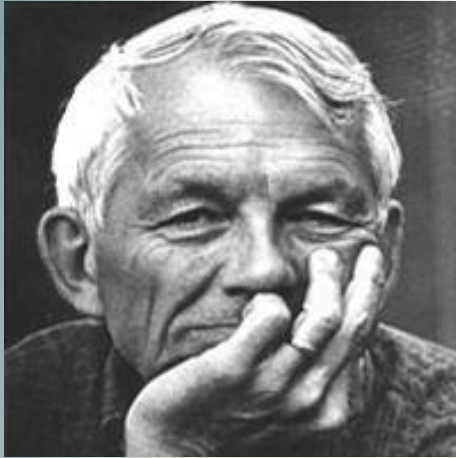


A Tribute to Bob Byers And His World-class Photographic Exhibit

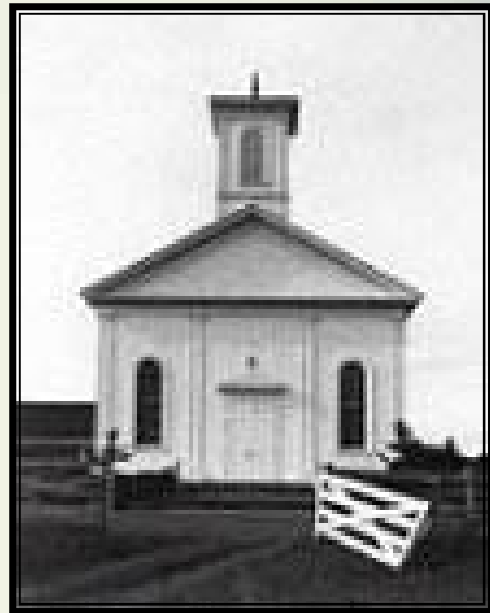
cessfully in this area for years. His love of the natural beauty of California and his friendship with other devoted photographers like Ansel Adams led him to become a nationally known photographer. He has captured the beauty of Yosemite and many other areas near and far. He is a longstanding member of the Friends of Photography and is frequently compared to Adams, his good friend. This exhibit that delights us is a display of Bob's favorites.

Bob Byers has gone beyond his friend aesthetically. He composes carefully using every aspect of camera technique. It is not just technical perfection that grabs us. We see



what he wants us to see through his eyes. Delight in the automobile and speed itself gleams in the face of the Rolls Royce and the Speedster. The stark angles of houses and rooflines in black and white are almost abstract designs standing alone. Drifting sand has sharp edges yet undulates across the photo. The swans on the
