



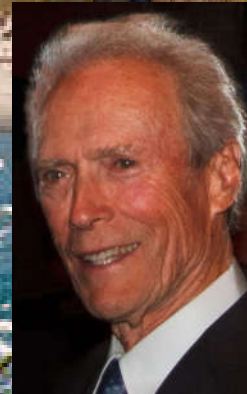

Monterey County Symphony

The season opens in October with a new composition by Emmy Award Winner, John Wineglass, that was created for the Carmel Centennial Celebration and will continue with the brilliant theme throughout its series of six concerts, "Shakespeare in Music"



We can look forward to a season of six concerts, each program featuring a Shakespearean title in music. Maestro Max Bragado-Darman, he who originated the theme, was a nine year old boy in Madrid when he attended a rehearsal of the symphony orchestra where his friend's father was the Conductor. He was moved by both sound, the aesthetic effect of the music, and the marvelous magic of the man who waved the baton and made it all happen. He had found his calling. He came to Oberlin College in the United States for a Master Degree in orchestral conducting and did further post graduate work at the University of Michigan. Before coming to Monterey he had returned to Spain and established himself as a music director and conductor of the symphony orchestra of Castile and Leon in Valladolid, Spain. He prepares very thoroughly for the job he loves, saying that he describes his work as "having an orchestra in Paradise".

The six concerts featuring Shakespeare will wow us with the following: October, Prokofiev, *Romeo and Juliet*, November, Mendelsohn, *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, February, Brahms, *Coriolanus*, March, Tchaikovsky, *Romeo and Juliet*, April, Verdi, *Othello*, May Nicolai, *The Merry Wives of Windsor*.

Monterey county Symphony, 2016/2017 Season, Shakespeare in Music: on the Monday prior to each concert, during the Symphony season (October, November, February, March, April and May), Musicologist, Dr. Todd Samra,

will present a talk about the upcoming program's music, composer, guest performers, etc. The lectures, known as the **Symphony Preview** take place at Carmel Valley Manor in the Library at 11:00AM.

This will be Dr. Samra's sixth year as an enthusiastic and popular representative of the Symphony. Organized by Julia Wilson for many years, the Symphony Preview is now coordinated by Ramona Smith.



On October 17, Dr. Samra will be accompanied by Symphony Board Chairman, Lee Rosen and Guest Composer, John Wineglass. The October program features John Wineglass's original composition "Big Sur: The Night Sun" commissioned for the Carmel Centennial Celebration. Also

on the October program are Ludwig van Beethoven, Concerto for Piano, Violin and Cello OP. 56 and Sergei Prokofiev, Suite No. 2 Romeo and Juliet.
