REVIEW OF THE BIDDING AT THE BRIDGE TABLE

The CVM Bridge Club is sanctioned by the ACBL to run Contract Bridge games in accordance with its Laws and award master-points. Among the duties of the Director is to "administer and interpret the Laws".

In a recent game the question arose at one table as to whether it was permissible for players to ask for a review of the bidding before play began. The Director should have been consulted, but later I was asked for an "opinion" and I imagine there may be other players who would like to know.

First we note that we bid quietly by using cards which should be clearly visible to all at the table throughout the auction. So the bidding is no secret and,

if one has not made an effort to remember it, he has only handicapped his own play.

Be that as it may, the current question is in regard to a review of the bidding after the final pass. Law 41 is very clear: "Before the opening lead is faced, the leader's partner and the declarer may, at his first turn to play a card, require a review of the auction... this right expires when he plays a card".

Law 20C says "the player may not ask for a partial restatement or halt the restatement before it is completed"

Law 20D adds: "A request to have calls restated shall be responded to only by an opponent".
