Touch of Evil is a 1958 film noir crime drama, written, directed by, and co-starring Orson Welles. The screenplay was loosely based on the novel *Badge of Evil*, by Whit Masterson. Along with Welles, the cast includes Charlton Heston, Janet Leigh, Joseph Calleia, Akim Tamiroff, and Marlene Dietrich. The film is one of the last examples of film noir in the genre's classic era. Since its release, its reputation has grown, and it is now widely regarded as one of Welles' best films, and also one of the best classic-era films noir.
