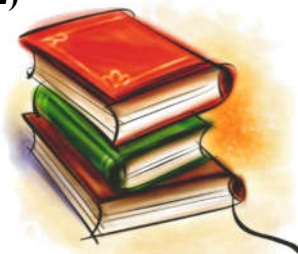

LEST WE FORGET - DOTTIE BROWN

Recently ACCENTS initiated a sometime-column recognizing residents of Hillcrest or the Health Center. These residents, who we may have forgotten or never knew, made significant contributions to the Manor while formerly living as independent residents. Our featured person this issue is Dottie Brown, one we know you will heartily agree is most deserving of recognition in today's LEST WE FORGET.



In 2000, Dottie and her husband, Art, moved here from Del Mesa. Like some other new residents, she was carried away, signing up for seven committees and being selected for them all! Beyond that, former Council President Lyman Horton persuaded her to chair both Movies and Housekeeping.

Well, as you might know, she more than surprised 'em all. For Movies, she signed the first agreement with Mid Valley Video to acquire pre-released, first-run movies, initiated the upgrading of the old projector and screen, and increased showings to five a month. For Housekeeping, she changed the mission to *advisory*, helping to pioneer the classification of some committees as *assisting* rather than *directing* the staff. She initiated the upgrading of Guest Unit A porch steps and roofing to protect the unit from rain and instituted weekend maid service for all the guest units that previously were covered only on weekdays. She also divided the campus into zones. With each committee member responsible for a zone, this helped broaden Housekeeping's coverage.

She was also involved with other committees. Over a span of nearly fifteen years, she became chair of these committees: 1) *Library* – 3 years, following in the fine footsteps of Joan Smith and Joan Chambers and instituting several new practices and procedures. She helped the Manor to achieve one of the finest libraries you'll

find in a community like ours; 2) *Special Events* – 2 years, pioneering new programs that for the first time featured top notch professionals, lifting the level of programs to that being offered today; and 3) *A New Resident Welcoming* - 2 years, significantly upgrading the functioning of this important committee with new practices, training, and procedures that are still being used today.

As if these tasks were not enough, prior to moving to Hillcrest with Art, she 1) worked in the ROSE several times a month, 2) played bridge three times a week, 3) hiked frequently with the Half-fast Walkers, 4) played golf at Quail, 5) devoured 3 or 4 books a month, 6) was featured as the lead in two of Pat Hughes's major presentations, and 7) still managed to enjoy many a getaway with Art ... you name it; the Browns have been there.

While she has slowed down a bit, she is still actively participating in Hillcrest activities, taking in most of the movies being offered and, incidentally, helping with their selection.

Adding to all this, Dottie will be the first to point out graciously that there are several other remarkable residents who have likewise contributed to the wonderful lifestyle we enjoy. Yes, that is true, but this week we are recognizing Dottie Brown, vowing not to forget her for all she has done for all of us.
