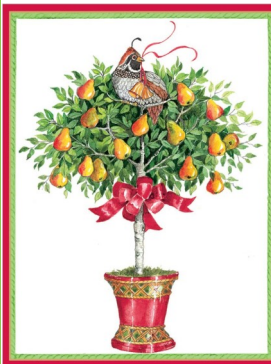

She said that when she and her husband traveled, they always brought back, not only a book (rather than pictures) about the cities they were in, but a paperweight, because those were easy to pack. She is sad to have had to give away all her books from around the world, as well as much of their art work.

So there you have our new "family." With her art work, paperweights, orchids, plants, azaleas, and her little Shih Tzu, we welcome Aliceon and Champ to Carmel Valley Manor!
