On July 20th, the contemporary Southwestern Native American Cultures: Hopi, Navajo and Rio Grande Pueblos will be examined.

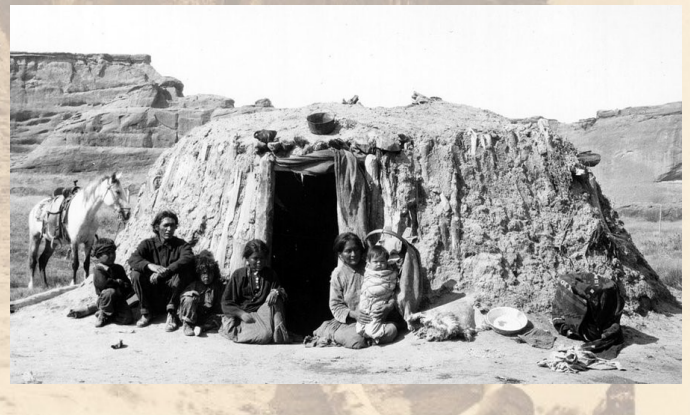
Enjoy Bruce's understanding of these cultures and the admiration he has for them.
