November 2 -- December 4

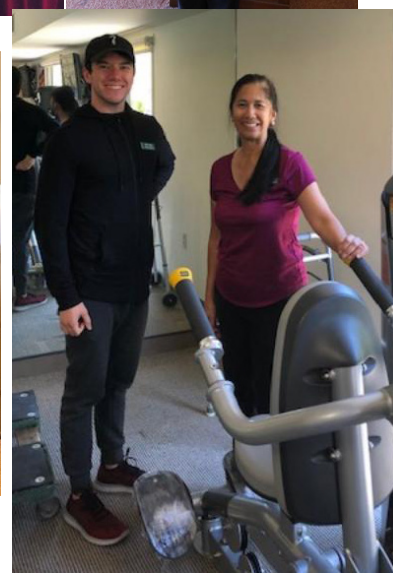

VETERANS DAY OVER TIME

“To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country’s service and with gratitude for the victory.”

President Woodrow Wilson, 1919, in proclaiming Armistice Day (which would later become Veterans Day) on the anniversary of the end of World War I.

“I saw your sons and your husbands, your brothers and your sweethearts. I saw how they worked, played, fought, and lived. I saw some of them die. I saw more courage, more good humor in the face of discomfort, more love in an era of hate, and more devotion to duty than could exist under tyranny.”

Comedian Bob Hope, 1944, in “I Never Left Home”, his book about going on tour to entertain the troops, which he did in every US conflict from World War II to the Persian Gulf War.

“Uncommon valor was a common virtue.”

Admiral Chester Nimitz, Battle of Iwo Jima, 1945

“Whatever gains are secured, it is loss the veteran remembers most keenly. Only a fool or a fraud sentimentalizes the merciless reality of war.”

Senator John McCain, 2008, in a foreign policy speech.

“There has been a great deal of talk about loyalty from bottom to top. Loyalty from the top to the bottom is much more important, and also much less prevalent. It is this loyalty from the top to the bottom which binds juniors to their seniors with the strength of steel.”

also known as Carolina Parakeet
(*Conuropsis carolinensis*)

**found from southern New York and Wisconsin to the Gulf of Mexico

**last known wild specimen killed in Okeechobee County, Florida in 1904

**last captive bird died at the Cincinnati Zoo in 1918

** why the Parakeet died out...space for agricultural land took away the bird's habitat, its colorful feathers were in demand as decorations in ladies' hats, killed in large numbers because farmers considered them a pest.

**not until 1939 was it determined that the bird had become extinct.
